The prospect of accomplishing *"The Hope of Christmas"* this year proved to be challenging. Haiti is in a state of paralysis at present. Gangs are the strongest form of government right now. Fuel is scarce. Lawlessness is increased. It is a dangerous place.

But with God, "*The Hope of Christmas*" has been successfully shared. Your prayers rose up as incense before God (Psalm 141:2). He carried our container through the port of Cap Haitien, moved it through customs, across lawless roads, and through the gates of our compound at Milot. Not one bag was lost. Then your gifts moved once more, safely across the countryside to Biclaire, Savane Carree, and beyond. Your gifts were greeted with joy by thousands of children. Carols were sung, the Gospel proclaimed, and many children responded to the invitation to receive God's great gift of Salvation. Thank you for helping with this great work. It is your work, and could not take place without you.
