
Here is the vision: changing a nation by changing the children ... one heart at a time ...

OTHER NEWS AND REPORTS:

► Saturday Home Bible Readings: several of our staff who attend the daily morning devotions are leading Bible readings in homes and villages around Milot. People simply gather for the reading of God's Word. Presently there are about 5 meetings each Sat morning.

► Covington Seminary Extension: plans are being made for Covington Seminary, of Rossville, GA. to begin a seminary extension program using GSM facilities in Milot. Joe Youngblood, Dean of International Extensions, will lead the effort. The goal is to offer theological training to local Haitian pastors, grounding them in the doctrines of God's Word.

Keswick Bible Conference: Don Graham led a team of 12 preachers for our Keswick Bible Conference July 3-5. Total attendance at the 6 venues was over 20,000

On Friday, Sept 25, a torrential downpour descended upon the village of Milot, including Mission Bon Berger, our main GSM compound in Haiti. Many of you have seen the mountain behind our compound. Rainwater descended from that mountain in powerful rivers. The water broke through the rear wall of our compound, destroying and scattering a 120 ft portion of that wall throughout the compound. The waters put such pressure on our west wall that about 40 ft of that wall was destroyed. Bill and our faithful Haitian workers labored in the midst of the flooding, clearing debris and drains so that the floodwaters could escape, and knocking holes in the remaining walls to relieve pressure on them. Water rose to several feet deep in the Chapel and in Faith Hall, but thankfully stopped inches short of entering the mission home. The floodwaters carried away much of our soil, eroding foundations at the elementary school, and ruining driveways and paths. There is much clean-up and repair to be done. Walls will have to be rebuilt, and dirt will have to be trucked in to rebuild the integrity of the elementary school foundation and to repair our drive-ways and paths. The cost of repairs is expected to be at least \$20,000. The security of our facilities has been compromised, and at this point, there are no funds at all available for the repairs. Nevertheless, Bill & Sandy are very thankful that the property damage was not worse, and that there was no loss of life.

Things to Pray for ...

• FINANCIAL NEEDS: that God would continue to move people & abundantly supply the financial needs of GSM.

• MEDICAL TEAMS: Our medical ministry continues to be a great blessing to the people of Haiti. We are beginning to reach beyond our school children and minister to the needs of neighboring villages. Please pray that God would bless our two fall teams Nov 10-24.

• CHRISTMAS MINISTRY: our annual Christmas Bag ministry is in full swing. Pray for things to go well as we transport bags to Melbourne and then on to Haiti. Pray for customs to go well and for the Christmas Team to have a great week Dec 1-8.

 MORNING BIBLE STUDY: that God would continue to bless and strengthen the daily Bible study Bill leads.

• OUR CHRISTAN SCHOOLS: are the core of what we do. Pray for our teachers & principals. We are thankful for their faithfulness. We want them to grow in their ownership of the missionary vision of GSM.

• FEEDING CENTER AT MILOT: we have a goal of feeding a meal a day to our school children in Milot. We are continuing to move toward that goal. We have the ovens we need, a new roof on the feeding center, and the funds for utensils. Our biggest challenge now is a dedicated source of funding, or an endowment, that will consistently supply needs for feeding 700 children a day.

• ENCOURAGEMENT: pray that God would continue to inspire and strengthen Bill & Sandy in their daily service.
