Most of the work is on the new high school, and preparations for the soon opening of the medical clinic. We did have one brave young man that went down in March. He helped Bill with the installation and wiring of 28 new solar panels, solar chargers, wiring for the clinic and school, and other tasks. Bill was very thankful for the help and good fellowship.

So he was of tremendous help in getting our 28 new solar panels mounted, wired, and running. The panels went down on the Christmas container back in the fall. 


## **Campus Life Week**


