



## ANNUAL GSM BIBLE CONFERENCES

Once a year GSM holds simultaneous Bible Conferences in churches throughout northern Haiti. Many of the churches are pastored by men who graduated from our GSM schools. March 19-26 we were in 5 churches and took 10 preachers. We were at two churches in Cap Haitien - New Jerusalem and Bethesda. We also preached at Morne Pele Baptist Church, Mount Calvary Baptist Church in Gran Pre, and First Baptist Church of Grand Rivierre. There were five services at each church. Combined total attendance for all five locations averaged nearly 2000 people each service for a total attendance for the week of nearly 10,000 people. The response was great. The church in Haiti is strengthened!
