Bill & Sandy are doing well. They are getting settled in to a routine where they come to the U.S. once a month so that Sandy can get her immuno-therapy treatment. That is going very well and she is feeling good. Continue to pray for God's healing mercies on her body and God's continued blessings for Bill's good health.

New Equipment

After 16 very good years, our faithful Diahatsu truck has finished the course. For those of you that don't know, 16 years on Haitian roads is the same as 200 years on American roads. Now that is said in jest. However, there is a great bit of truth in the comparison. And our good truck is done.

But wonderfully, through 4 individuals and 1 church, God has provided a new truck, completely paid for and delivered to our garage in Milot!

And there is another miracle: the new truck was on the opposite end of the country, at a dealer in Port-au-Prince - a no man's land controlled by the gangs. But Christian Lavaux, working with a very street-wise man in Port-au-Prince, and employing very shrewd tactics, successfully navigated gangs, protests, and roadblocks, to arrive safely in Milot. God answers prayer!

A Word from the Field

As I was flying back into Haiti today (*Tue June 27*) there were two things on my mind. And both were wonderful praises for God's faithfulness. The first was for how God has so graciously dealt with Sandy and I concerning the cancer that was discovered in May of 2022, on the day before we were to return to Haiti. Following her operation and all the different treatments she has endured, the doctor now reports that he can find no signs of cancer in Sandy, and that she should be finished with her last immuno-therapy treatment in January. She is with me today as we return for a couple of weeks to begin a new project. The second wonderful praise is that our Haitian leadership team headed by Christian Lavaux has been doing an excellent job of moving the ministry forward. Since the beginning of the year they have: 1) successfully brought in our shipping container (*it was filled with the children's gifts for our annual Christmas ministry, many very needed supplies, as well as 9 tons of food relief*); 2) led the ministry through another successful school year; 3) purchased and taken possession of a new truck to replace the one that has served us for so many years; and 4) completed a very long process of renewing the licenses for all eight of our schools (*occupying 3 campuses*). What is so amazing is that all of this has been done in a country that is extremely dangerous and lacking in any government stability and structure. I thank God for these men and for His continued faithfulness and blessings on this ministry. I also thank all of the supporters that have so faithfully enabled us to continue this work that God has called us to.
